While every manufacturer is different, you can be sure that each car must meet rigorous standards every time.

As an example, let's take a look at the conditions for a Toyota model to be considered for its CPO program. To start, each vehicle that's considered for the program must be no more than six years old and have no more than 85,000 miles on the odometer. If the car doesn't meet one of these requirements, it can't be considered CPO.

Once the car has successfully passed these initial requirements, it must then pass a 160-point inspection. This comprehensive inspection covers everything from engine performance under a number of conditions all the way to whether the vehicle history report shows a clean record.

If the vehicle is able to pass this extensive 160-point inspection, it's provided with a 12-month/12,000-mile Comprehensive Warranty. Drivers are even given a 7-year/100,000-mile Limited Powertrain Warranty. Finally, Toyota also includes a 1-year Roadside Assistance program with their CPO vehicles.







What's Covered Under CPO Warranties?

CPO warranties can be a huge help for drivers looking to keep themselves protected from random malfunctions. If there's an issue with your vehicle, a warranty can ensure that you have the necessary repairs covered by the manufacturer. However, you may be wondering what you can expect to be covered under a manufacturer's warranty.

Using Toyota as an example once again, drivers will be pleased to find that the models covered by a 7-year/100,000-mile Limited Powertrain Warranty offer quite a lot of coverage.

The main part that the Limited Powertrain Warranty covers is for the outside of the engine. However, that's not the only place you'll have peace of mind with after years of driving. You'll also have it for covered parts inside the engine, including the camshaft, timing belt, cylinder heads, and oil reservoir. You can be sure that even after heavy use, your engine will be well taken care of.
